 - 10X10 booth spaces and they will be marked with your number
 - ONE designated parking spot per vendor, you will be issued a parking card for your vehicle
 - You must provide your own 10x10 Canopy tent; No tarps or Tents please.
 - Vendor Number and Vendor permit must be displayed in plain sight.
 - You must provide your own table and chairs
- No electricity provided or extension cords to the building \ May use propane stoves or generators
- Set up time; starting @ 7AM. Break down by 4PM \ please clean-up your booth area.
- Roads will be closed during the parade, you will not be able to go in & out after 9:00AM
- New: The Yakama Nation Department of Revenue Requires a Vendor permit. **Deadline June 1, 2017**

Call to Artists

The Yakama Nation Cultural Heritage Center is again hosting a special vendor's area for the Native Artists Market during celebration activities on June 8, 2017.

Native artists are welcome to apply to sell their original, handmade works of art. All mediums and genres (traditional, customary and contemporary) of art work are being accepted for consideration.

Objectives

- To create an opportunity for native artists to gain exposure for their art work
- To provide entrepreneurial opportunities for native artists
- To create an opportunity for the community to purchase quality handmade native arts and crafts

Eligibility

- Yakama Nation artists will receive priority consideration
- Enrolled members of any federally recognized Tribe may apply
- All work to be sold in the Native Artists Market must be original and hand made by the artists identified on the application
- Eligible items include (but not limited to): jewelry, beadwork, fiber art, pottery, quilts, and custom furniture, stained and blown glass, heritage crafts, photography, woodwork, sculpture, clothing, accessories, and mixed media works.
- Ineligible items include crafts made from store-bought kits or molds, manufactured items that have been assembled, resale or mass produced items
- Potential artists must submit an application form with photographs of items intended for sale at the Native Artists Market during the June 8 celebration

Booth Fee

A single 10' x 10' booth space costs \$10 for the day. Electricity is not provided.

You can call to request an application (509)865-2800 x4729 or email Athena@yakama.com. Please identify that you are applying to the Native Artists Market.

Rules

- An artist must let the Cultural Heritage Center staff know when he or she would like to offer new items or mediums aside from those identified on the original application
- Set up can begin at 7:00 am. The space must be cleaned up by 4:00 pm
- Cancellations: An artist who needs to cancel a booth reservation should let the Cultural Heritage Center staff know by 5:00 pm May 19, 2017.
- 10' x 10' Space: Each artist will be assigned a 10' x 10' booth space for display of his or her products. The artist may not place displays or products out of the designated area or walkways.
- General:
 - No alcohol consumption or smoking on the market grounds
 - No overnight camping on the Cultural Heritage Center property
 - No open flames inside the vendors' booths
- Parking places for Native Artists Market vendors will be designated in the Northeastern parking lot of the Cultural Heritage Center (one vehicle per VENDOR)
